## 2. Cal-Neva Chapter Update

- Chapter Update Laurie Earley
  - Revising and moving towards a 5-year Strategic Plan, and looking for feedback from members
- Membership Update Heather Benko
  - Low numbers from Nevada
  - Membership update will be posted on the website
  - Requested recommendations on how to expand the membership base
- 2017 Report Card Joe Merz
  - Report card can be found on the website and includes the following information:
    - Planned and conducted meeting in Eureka
    - Planned and conducted meeting in SLO
    - Working with Wildlife Society for joint meeting in Reno
    - Key fisheries issues letters provided
    - Provided donation to Miller and Lea
    - 5 continuing education courses with over 100 attendees
    - Promoted certification program talked with parent society to figure out how to improve the process
    - Worked with agencies to help increase attendance by government employees
    - Working towards 5 student chapters
    - Ex Com members have met with student subunits to help build leadership skills
    - Website has been revamped
    - Jobs getting posted on website
    - Co-sponsored the delta smelt workshop

- We provide a yearly report to Parent Society, working on getting our strategic plan to be complementary to the society report
- Looking to develop a small grants program for the chapter

### 3. Treasurer Report - Jim Hobbs

- Finance Update:
  - Checking Account: \$97,195.54Savings Account: \$38,762.20Merrill Lynch: \$105,137.68
- Last year's meeting took in over \$26,000.
  - Profits are rolled over to the next year to provide funding for student and professionals to travel to meetings,
  - Funding available for small grants
  - Continuing education courses outside the annual meeting brought in additional funds
- Look to make a profit of approximately \$10,000/annual meeting
- Investment account earning an extra \$4K to \$5K per year due to market conditions
- 2018 Budget
  - Money is spent on sending Ex Com officers to Western Division and National meetings
  - Provide student support spent \$1,500 last year for seed money to each subunit
  - Money is set aside to sponsor events
  - Set money aside for socials (e.g., with the Wildlife Society)
  - Added 2 new line items to this year's budget
    - \$8,000 set aside to support travel to the 2019 meeting
    - \$5,000 set aside for a social and full-day symposium
  - Contingency budget was set up so that we can cover unexpected requests
  - Budget Approval:
    - Motion to approve: Jim Hobbs
      - Question regarding small grants program increased from \$1,000 to \$2,500. Jim explained that money was available to increase

- Bylaws changes made up for vote
  - Elected officers could not serve consecutive terms. New bylaws changing this requirement
  - Approved by parent society
  - Will be forwarded to governing committee

#### 6. Awards and Grants

- Chapter Awards Pat Coulston (Awards Committee Chair)
  - 8 chapter awards to be presented tonight
  - Award will be presented for the student subunit for Santa Cruz
- Travel Grants Shawn Acuña (Travel Awards Committee Chair)
  - Hard to get people to apply for travel grants looking for recommendations on how to recruit more applicants
  - Offered to students as well as early professionals
  - 2 travel awards will be given at the banquet
  - 2 \$750 travel grants are up for grabs to attend the national meeting
  - Comment provided about clarifying how the money can be used
  - 2 travel grant programs -
    - Student subunit travel grant program
    - Individual travel award, member in good standing, do not have to be giving a talk or poster, but it does weigh into the selection
      - ➤ Cal-Neva meeting 2 \$500 awards are available
      - > Semi-annual travel award 2 \$750 awards are available

# 7. 2019 Reno Meeting Update - Dan Cassidy (AFS Deputy Executive Director) and Jesse Trushenski (AFS Vice President)

- Heavy lifting usually done by chapters is now being conducted by National staff
- Biggest concern is the depth of what needs to be done, not just the breadth
- Planning for an annual meeting begins 4 or 5 years in advance
- Meeting will be held at the convention center in Reno
- Looking to ensure it will be a joint meeting rather than seeming to be 2 separate meetings
- Anticipated attendance of around 5,000 people
- Currently looking to make sure all the agreements and understandings are in place
- Volunteers will be supported by National staff
- National planning staff is inviting the Cal-Neva planning committee members to join the calls for the Atlantic City meeting preparation to get a heads up on what will be expected
- Looking to set up talks with different perspectives for conservation

- Chapter nexus is through the programming chairs and programming committee
  - Looking to get volunteers at the meeting on Friday to help with the meeting planning
