- Continuing Education (CE) 2024 Redding Conference Update
- Proposed Field Tours (FT)
- FT I. Fantasy Floodplains Lead Matt Johnson, CDFW and others
- Participants will visit several floodplain restoration sites along the Sacramento River including Nur Pon Open Space and Anderson River Park. Participants will learn about the planning, implementation, and monitoring of these floodplain restoration projects.
- FT II. 30 Years Post Cantara Revisited Lead Dr. Richard Lis, CDFW and others
- In 1991, a Southern Pacific Railroad chemical tank car fell off the track known as the Cantara Loop into the upper Sacramento River near Mt. Shasta spilling 19,000 gallons of the herbicide metam sodium impacting 45 miles downstream and into Lake Shasta eliminating life. Learn about the recovery processes from millions of dead fishes, amphibians, aquatic invertebrates, and riparian corridors to the \$38 million settlement, restoration, land acquisition and protection, research and public education lead by the Cantara Trustee Council.
- FT III. Revisioning of Clear Creek Leads Derek Rupert, BOR, DJ Bandrowski, Yurok Tribe
- Unique opportunities created unique partnerships! Participants will learn about the planning, implementation, and monitoring of floodplain restoration and spawning site projects.
- FT IV. Native Fishes Placeholder Leads Damon Goodman, CalTrout and Dr. Stewart Reid
- Proposed Field Learning Experiences (FLE)
- FLE I: Drone Detectives: Using Drones to capture Realtime Fishery Data JT Robinson, CDWR
- Participants will learn about drones function, record data, and different data analysis techniques. Participants will observe drone deployment techniques, discuss strengths and weaknesses of using drones for field work, and potentially assist with drone deployment.
- FLE II: Urban Streams = Winter Refugia to the World Class Trout Fishery Mike Berry, retired CDWR

- Learn about how urban streams function (or not) to assist (or not) in providing winter refugia for the rainbow trout that contribute to the Sacramento River's World Class recreational fishery. It is possible that participants may assist with fish capture and tagging.
